



#### War casualty statistics

- Horses 7/1914: Germany 715,000; A-H 600,000
- Verdun, 2/1916->: France & Germany: over 1 mio. dead
- Sommes river, June 1916-> British lost 58,000 on first day (compare Vietnam) Total Allied: 600,000 by November
- Total military *casualties*: A-H 90% of 7.8 mio=7mio 76% of 12 mio=9.1 mio [4.9 mio. wounded] Russia: British Empire: 73% of 8.9 mio=6.1mio [4.2 w.] France: 73% of 8.4mio=6.2 mio [3.6 w.] 65% of 11 mio.=7.1 mio [3.6 w.] Germany: 8% of 4.4mio=.32mio [.2 w]

- 180: Rhine fortresses
  - 181, 198: fleet, no air forces
- 227-230: Kaiser & German generals: war criminals
  231: "Germany accepts the responsibility for all the loss and damage..." (but
- 428: 15-year occupation of Rhine by France (431: maybe end sooner)
