

A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE

Please join us at noon on Sunday Nov. 19 in HSSB 4020 (the History Department Conference Room) for lunch and a talk by Irwin Appel, Professor of Theater. We will then proceed to the nearby Performing Arts Theater for the 2pm performance of *A View from the Bridge* (directed by Prof. Appel). Appel, a graduate of Princeton University and the Juilliard School, is also the Director of the BFA Actor Training Program at UCSB and an Equity actor and composer/sound designer. His acting credits include Prospero in *The Tempest*, Shylock in *The Merchant of Venice*, Bottom in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, Timon in *Timon of Athens*, and Oscar Wilde in *Gross Indecency: the Three Trials of Oscar Wilde*.

A View from the Bridge is a classic work of American theater. Set in the mid-1950s in Red Hook, a dockworker's community in Brooklyn, it tells the story of longshoreman Eddie Carbone and a fatal mistake that changes his family forever. This raw, gritty, and explosive story, with its themes of immigration, community, pride, and secret love, remains as relevant today as on the day it opened on October 11, 1956. A 2015 revival of the play in London won three Olivier Awards, and a 2016 revival in New York won three Tony Awards.
